#### FY24 Mini-Appropriations Bill Brings \$29.165 Million to Ports-to-Plains Alliance Projects

March 12, 2024 - LUBBOCK, TX: The recent passage of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2024 (H.R. 4366) marks another significant milestone for the Ports-to-Plains Alliance corridor. This legislation, which cleared the U.S. Senate on Friday, March 8, 2024, and the U.S. House on Wednesday, March 6, 2024, was signed into law by President Biden on Saturday, March 9, 2024.

Among the notable provisions of the bill are allocations totaling \$29.165 million for four community projects benefitting the Ports-to-Plains Alliance corridor. These projects were championed by various U.S. House members and Senators, reflecting a bipartisan commitment to infrastructure development.

Congressman Ronny Jackson (TX-13) secured funding for two critical projects:

- US 287 Interstate Design, Amarillo to Dumas: \$2 million
- State Loop 335 Widen Non-Freeway, Amarillo, Texas: \$2.2 million

Congressman Jodey Arrington (TX-19) successfully advocated for:

Interstate Planning: U.S. 87 from Lubbock to Tahoka: \$8 million

Congressman August Pfluger (TX-11) secured funding for:

US 277—Operational Improvements in San Angelo: \$2.5 million

Additionally, two projects received funding through the U.S. Senate:

- Ports-to-Plains Corridor Interstate Planning (New Mexico): \$1.6 million, championed by Senators Martin Heinrich and Ben Ray Luján
- · Heartland Expressway Improvements (Nebraska): \$12.865 million, secured by Senator Deb Fisher

The total appropriations of \$29.165 million, combined with the FY23 appropriations of \$11.85 million, provide state Departments of Transportation (DOTs) with substantial funding to advance critical infrastructure projects. Notably, this funding does not rely on formula distribution, ensuring targeted investment in key transportation initiatives.

"As a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, I have the opportunity to directly advocate for federal resources that deliver for working families in New Mexico — and that's exactly what this legislation does," said Senator Martin Heinrich of New Mexico. "Today, I was proud to vote for this first package of appropriations bills that will deliver critical investments to every corner in New Mexico, addressing our community needs," said Senator Ben Ray Luján of New Mexico.

"The Heartland Expressway Association is grateful to US Senator Deb Fischer for securing \$12.8 million in the FY 2024 budget for work on the current construction phase of the Heartland Expressway between Minatare NE and US Highway 385 junction east of Scottsbluff. This critical piece of funding will assure the creation of another 18 miles of 4-lane divided highway in western Nebraska", said Deb Cottier, Board Chair from Chadron, NE.

# The Port-to-Plains Corridor in Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Colorado

- □ The Ports-To-Plains Corridor, designated by Congress as a High Priority Corridor on the NHS in 1998 between the United State/ Mexico border at Laredo, Texas to Denver, Colorado
- □963 lane miles in Texas, 92 lane miles in New Mexico, 34 lane miles in Oklahoma, and 281 lane miles in Colorado (196 to Limon; 85 from Limon to Denver)



# Ports-to-Plains in Colorado

The US 287 Bridge Preventative Maintenance – Phases 1 and 2 maintains two bridges north of Eads and seven close to Springfield in Baca and Kiowa counties. \$5 million is funded through SB 267.

# Ports-to-Plains in Oklahoma

■Work Plan -

Reconstruct / Rehabilitate existing facility **US-287**: Begin 14.94 Mi SE of JCT US-64 (US-412), extend NW 7.00 MI (estimate \$7.5 million) (FY 2029)

■Work Plan -

US-287: Begin approximately 13.28 miles N OF Van Buren St in Boise City, extend north approximately 4.5 miles (estimate \$18.5 million) (FY 2027)

# Ports-to-Plains in New Mexico

- □ In March of 2024, the FY 24 appropriations funding was improved which included the \$1.6 million request (2.0 million including the state match) for the Clayton alignment study.
- □ Currently, Raton has submitted a similar request for a FY 2025 appropriation to conduct an alignment study at Raton.
- □ After meeting with NMDOT, there is a possibility of studying the whole alignment through New Mexico.

# What is going on with Ports-to-Plains in Texas?

- □ In 2015 Texas voters passed Prop 1 and Prop 7 putting oil and gas severance and sales tax into the State Highway Fund. In 2016 the UTP went from \$35B to \$75B (The 2025 UTP was approved in August 2024 at \$104B)
- □ In March of 2022, the Texas and New Mexico portions of the Ports-to-Plains Corridor were designated by Congress as a future interstate highway. (Cruz, Cornyn, Heinrich, Lujan, Arrington, Cuellar, Fernandez)
- □ In March 2024, you can finally put a number on it. "Future IH 27" In December 2023 Arrington's bill passed the House. In March 2024, Cruz championed it through the Senate



# First IH 27 Expansion Since 1992

The opening of a 6-mile section on I-27 in **1992** completed the Interstate Highway System in Texas.

On September 5, 2024, FHWA signed off on TxDOT's application to add a 4.2-mile segment from the existing terminus in Lubbock Texas on US 87 south of Lubbock.

Dear Mr. Williams:

We received the request from the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to add a 4.2-mile segment from the existing terminus in Lubbock, Texas, to the new limits of U.S. Highway 87 (U.S. 87) access control located 0.1 mile north of County Road 7500, south of Lubbock. This segment is part of the High Priority Corridor 38 (Ports-to-Plains Corridor) that is a designated future part of the Interstate System by Section 1105(e)(5)(A) of the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991, as amended.

Our Texas Division Office has reviewed TxDOT's designation package, conducted field reviews, and confirmed that the 4.2 miles of U.S. Highway 87 meet all standards for a highway on the Interstate System.

I find the requirements of Section 1105(e)(5)(A) have been satisfied and hereby approve the 4.2-mile addition to the Interstate System as I-27.




